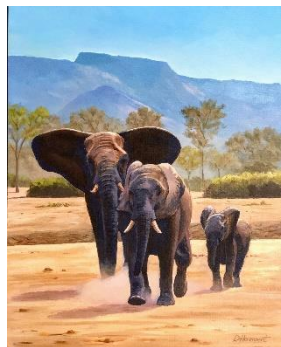

MAY 27 at 7:00pm (in-person) – DEAN HOORNAERT (oil wildlife): Dean is a long-time Californian and attended UC Berkeley in the mid-80s earning a degree in mechanical engineering. He moved to the South Bay where he has lived and worked ever since. He is particularly proud to have helped design the da Vinci Surgical Robot as part of the Intuitive Surgical team. After retiring in 2016 he turned his attention to two other great interests, art and travel. Twice in his life he has had the opportunity to travel around the world for an extended period, the last time with his wife and young family accompanying him. Those 15 months away included more than 6,000 miles on tandem bicycles as they explored more than 24 countries on six continents. Dean then turned his attention to art, taking classes and developing his skills in multiple mediums such as watercolor, acrylics, oils, pastels, and charcoal. He uses the travel photos as inspiration for his paintings, which primarily focus on wildlife and landscapes he encountered around the world. His goal is to capture the light, color, and mood of these amazing places in order to share their beauty with others.
