FEBUARY 26, 2025, JIM CALDWELL, Zoom Presentation, 7:00pm: We will once again be treated to one of Jim's informative art history documentaries this time about Mary Cassatt's brilliant and fascinating career, following up on the recent exhibit of her works at the Legion of Honor which closed on January 26. Mary Cassatt holds a unique place in the history of American artists. She spent 60 years in France and she was the only American to have exhibited with the Impressionists. She never married or had children, but her reputation was secured by her tender portrayal of the relationship between mother and child. She was a close friend of Edgar Degas, Berthe Morisot and Camille Pissarro. Her paintings are in the collections of most major museums, but she was also considered to be one of the greatest printmakers of her generation. Jim Caldwell is an artist, teacher, art historian, and architect, and long-time Woodside resident.
